Homework Portal

Our district has added a valuable tool for parents as part of the Online Resource Directory. Presently, parents are able to access the websites (K-12) and homework (6-12) of staff by visiting webpage links available through the main district homepage. However, this often requires visiting several websites if your children are in grades 6-12 and it can be a time consuming task, especially with more than one child.

With the addition of the Homework Portal, parents can create a customized listing of teachers to access homework and events. All homework for students in grades 6-12 and all website links and events for students in grades K-12 will be organized by student name in one place. In addition, we are in the process of adding all building events (non-athletic) so that they will also appear next to each child's name. This site will serve as one place to access all homework, teacher events, web links, and building events.

Follow the steps below to setup your Homework Portal account:

1. Click on the "Homework Portal" link on the left hand side of the main district homepage above the "ORD" links. Then, click on the redirect link to the Bernards Township Homework Portal site.
2. Click on the "Sign up" button at the bottom of the screen and enter an email address and password. This does not have to be the same login information used for Home Access Center. Multiple accounts can be created.
3. Next, login to the system using the information provided and click on the "Add Student" to enter your child's name. Enter all children using this method.
4. Once all children have been entered, click on the school each child attends and select their teachers. You will be prompted to assign each child to the appropriate building. Once completed, all homework and calendar events for the teacher will be listed for each student on the virtual blackboard.

There is a tutorial guide and useful video available on the Homework Portal site if questions arise. We hope you find this resource useful. Students should also be encouraged to use this as an organizational tool to access daily homework and weblinks.
