In general music class, students at LCS often focus on a particular “Music for the Month” for each month of the school year. This allows students to really get to know a musician, a culture, or a style in greater depth.

In **grades two through five** I provide five **clues or questions** about the music the week before we begin learning. Students are encouraged to **research** those five clues and find the answer to who or what the music is. If the student finds the answer they will receive extra credit, a sticker, and a small music trinket. Along with the clues, I will provide the dates that the clues are announced as well as the date the answers are due.

How to find the Music of the Month Clues on Mrs. Beadle’s Website:

2. Click on Teacher’s Websites
3. Click on Beadle, Carol
4. Click on Mystery Music of the Month.

In addition, the clues will be sent through the Friday Folder and given to each classroom teacher.

Please encourage your students to participate in this fun and interactive activity. They can use the internet, books, or just simply ask adults they know. All they have to do is provide some sort of extra information – facts, a CD, sheet music, a book, a video, etc.
