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SAFE RETURN TO IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION

(1) IN GENERAL - A local educational agency receiving funds under this section shall develop and make publicly available on the local educational agency's website, not later than 30 days after receiving the allocation of funds described in paragraph (d)(1), a plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services.

2) COMMENT PERIOD.—Before making the plan described in paragraph (1) publicly available, the local educational agency shall seek public comment on the plan and take such comments into account in the development of the plan.

LEA Response Table

1) Universal and correct wearing of masks ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

Anyone may wear a mask at any time if they so choose. The CDC and NJ Department of Health advise that masks be worn after close contact exposure and if infected (testing positive). Individuals who need to mask due to a COVID-19 diagnosis or exposure are expected to monitor themselves. The district will not be contact tracing or enforcing masking unless extreme outbreak situations arise.

2) Physical distancing (e.g., including use of cohorts/podding) ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

Individuals that are experiencing symptoms associated with COVID-19 while at school will be directed to the school's Health Office, may be required to wear a mask while being evaluated, and sent home for medical evaluation including COVID-19 testing, at the discretion of the school nurse.

The school district recognizes that proper hand washing and respiratory etiquette can help reduce the transmission of COVID-19. Proper hand washing and respiratory etiquette will be taught to students in appropriate educational settings in school.

High touch surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected with appropriate registered EPA products at least daily. HVAC systems will be maintained and operated to maximize ventilation and filtration within the specifications of each individual piece of equipment. Air filtration will be supplemented with stand alone air filtration units.

5) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments

The district will not be contact tracing or enforcing masking unless extreme outbreak situations arise.

6) Diagnostic and screening testing([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

Screening testing will not be conducted in schools. Individuals who are exposed or who have COVID will be provided best practice guidance for how to use home tests to inform personal health decisions and when it is appropriate to return to community. Test kits will be made available to staff and families through the nurse's office.

Periodic communication providing information and recommendations regarding vaccination will be provided including newsletters, emails, and directions to sources such as the CDC. The district will also partner with the Bernards Township Health Department and advertise the vaccination opportunities that the Bernards Township Health Department is making available locally to staff and families.
