Individual coaches will contact their team members. Cost is calculated each year by the # of participants and has been in the range of \$85 per season which runs until State Finals on March 12th. All Students who participate should plan to be available on March 12th for the entire day.

What is DI? (in 30 seconds)

Our organization teaches students the skills of communication, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking. We use challenge-based learning to give them the opportunity to learn and experience the creative process from imagination to innovation. The result is that students pre-K through college learn social and emotional intelligence, literacy, and how to proactively solve problems. Through these experiences kids create new neural pathways in their brains that will move them to higher-order thinking and to a new level of self-efficacy. Together, we can change the world, one team at a time!

Did you know? In 2014-15, Bernards Township fielded 33 teams and each school was represented. Our students have consistently earned top recognition in the state and many go on to compete against teams from around the world at the Global Finals held at the University of Tennessee!
