There are times when a member of the public makes a comment or asks a question about an employee. New Jersey statute does not permit us to discuss personnel issues in public. Also as a matter of law, a Board of Education may only vote for or against the hiring of an employee upon the recommendation of the superintendent. If the superintendent does not recommend a person, that person's name is not listed on the agenda and there is no vote on that action. If it is necessary for the Board to go into executive session at the end of the meeting, we will provide an estimated length of time for the session and whether any action is anticipated to be taken upon returning to public session.

IX. Board Forum on Drugs & Alcohol

Comments by the Board President Robin McKeon included community feedback, interaction between the Board and the Municipal Alliance, formation of a local task force, the Safe Homes Program (with the Municipal Alliance maintaining a local list of safe homes), Parents for Substance Free Kids, discussion at various Board committee meetings including a review and revision of the health curriculum and adding additional modules in regard to drug and alcohol education, and various scheduled follow up programs including The Dilemma, and a student presentation of Pills to Heroin. She mentioned the involvement of student groups including RAD (Ridge Against Drugs) and the Ethics Club, suspicionless search for controlled dangerous substances using canines, and continuing data collection from other school districts. The district is exploring a breathalyzer policy, making the SRO at William Annin full time to that building and adding a SAC position at that school.

School nurses, at this time, are not permitted to dispense Narcan. The Board was provided a clarification of random drug testing and discussed potential consequences. It was advised by the Board counsel that the district follow the regulation regarding student consequences. Parents must be notified of a positive test result. Students who have privileges must submit to testing and if they opt out, would lose their privileges i.e. participation in extracurricular activities or parking on campus.

Discussion followed on the structuring of policies by the Policy Committee.
